

In the current session, Edward voted in 69% of divisions (missing 21 with paternity leave) - a better record than two-thirds of Conservative MPs.

Edward voted <u>AGAINST</u> ending the 10p tax rate, a 3rd runway at Heathrow and the Post Office closure plan. He voted <u>FOR</u> a referendum on Britain's EU membership, an Iraq War inquiry and the Corporate Manslaughter Bill.

Visiting schools is fun, but it's also vital. Seeing new schools now being built at Grand Avenue Primary and Chessington Community College is encouraging. Last year Edward helped stop a Government plan to take 5% from schools' reserves that threatened to hit schools from Tiffins to Coombe. A shortage of local primary places emerged in April: "I'm now working with parents and the council to solve the immediate difficulty and any longer term issues".

Council tenants are badly hit by two Labour Government policies forced on Kingston: Above inflation rent rises, plus a "tax" that takes 31p in every £1 of council rental income to subsidise councils elsewhere. Edward raised this with Gordon Brown, but regrettably his

Sadly, the recent fight against 5 post offices closing was unsuccessful. We were ignored, like elsewhere in the UK, despite a huge residents' petition and working with

local Tory and Labour politicians. Yet Edward's campaign to re-open Tolworth Broadway's post office (above) may well succeed this summer.

Another key campaign is for lower rail fares by re-zoning Kingston and Surbiton to zone 5 from zone 6. Edward persuaded Boris Johnson to back us and will continue the fight in 2008/09.
