Dear Resident,

This edition of my Report Back is slightly different to normal, focusing on how local people have faced the pandemic. I've left off politics in favour of sending you details of where to get help - like Kingston Council's "Stronger Together Hub" and the Government's latest advice.

I'd like to send my sincere thanks to people for their hard work and courage in this difficult year - from NHS staff and care workers, to key frontline workers - bus drivers, teachers, school staff and shop workers and many more - and countless numbers who've volunteered to help. You've been truly inspiring - beacons of light in some dark days.

And I'd like to send my deepest sympathies to those who have lost loved ones. If I can help you or, indeed, anyone else, do not hesitate to get in touch. Please excuse any delay in my replying – numbers of residents contacting me last year rose by over 300%, all too often with urgent issues who I of course have prioritised.

Alongside the health crisis, we've seen an economic crisis – with many local businesses and people severely affected. I'm pleased Ministers listened to the Lib Dem campaign on extending furlough. However, I'm incensed there's been no help at all for over 3 million people, mainly self-employed people, and too little for firms in sectors banned from trading normally - like hospitality, events and leisure.

Despite Covid-19, many of the things that I have been fighting for were achieved- from winning disabled access to the rear of Surbiton station to residents on Norbiton's Cambridge Estate voting overwhelmingly for the Royal Borough's largest, most exciting regeneration and council home building project for over 50 years.

I was also honoured to be elected Leader of the Liberal Democrats, in a nationwide campaign fought from my Surbiton home on "Zoom".

Let us hope the vaccination roll out is a success – and things improve rapidly this year. Please keep safe and follow the latest advice.


