Education & new schools

Progress in Kingston's schools and extra investment plans were **last year's highlight.** Despite Covid, local schools performed really well. Unusually, I'm highlighting one, Chessington School. Four years ago, low numbers created a budget crisis, but hard-pressed Kingston Council backed the school. Thanks to outstanding leadership, Chessington School now has a waiting list – it's so popular!

I'm also delighted Kingston is building new schools. From a secondary in Norbiton to expanding New Malden's Burlington primary, from a new primary on the Surbiton/Tolworth border to a special school for autistic pupils in Chessington, it's real progress. I'm campaigning nationally for more help for children affected by Covid, especially for mental health and well-being.



Health & care

Our NHS and care staff deserve massive thanks for their work during Covid. Pressures remain at hospitals like Kingston, and care home staff shortages are at crisis levels. I'm campaigning hard on this, focusing on family carers. My mantra is "If you care about the NHS, you must care about care" as NHS and care systems depend on each other.

NHS dentistry is a health issue the Government too often forgets about, where people have been hit hard during Covid. I've launched a new health campaign to support NHS dentists: I think we need more NHS dentists in our area, and Ministers need to support existing NHS dentists better.

Climate change & cleaner rivers

The fight against the scandal of sewage being dumped into rivers was led by my party in Parliament last year. I've proposed a sewage tax on the water industry's profits, for the clean up investments needed.

I'm also working constructively with Thames Water and Kingston Council to see if local sewage could be used to tackle climate change. New technologies can produce renewable heat from sewage and Surbiton's Hogsmill Sewage Site could host such clean heat generation.

A project team is now studying if a district heating system could distribute clean renewable heat from the Hogsmill site for new affordable homes in Norbiton, Norbiton's new secondary school, Kingston's new leisure centre and potentially even Kingston Hospital. Large parts of Kingston would no longer need gas for heating, cutting people's carbon emissions and cutting heating bills. This would keep Kingston at the forefront on climate action.

More police

Extra police for Kingston town was one of the year's biggest successes. I'd campaigned since 2018 for extra police there alongside the local Lib Dem-run Council. After just two months of the new team of 25 police officers being deployed, crime is already falling.

However, our campaigns for more police haven't stopped there. Although Kingston is one of London's safest Boroughs, increased visible police presence is vital to deter and catch criminals. So I'm campaigning with Chessington's Lib Dem councillors to save Hook Parade's police office from cuts by London's Mayor.
